In March I attended two different wider church events with members from this church. The first was at the River of Joy church in Wyoming, MI. This is a new church start. The event we attended was to announce that they were a Sanctuary Church.



Our Mission Board and some members of the church donated money in December to purchase a bunk bed for the church. They now have eight beds, a shower and some other items to provide for families and individuals who might need to stay there.

The church has made a public stand that they are holy ground and people need to feel safe there. Speaking at the event were many clergy, national staff from our denomination, an immigration lawyer and a young college student who was brought here as a young child by his parents. He is concerned that he will be forced to leave the only country he has known. His speech was very moving.

The second event was the March for Our Lives rally in Douglas, Michigan. Again, a number of us from the church participated. The day began at the Douglas United Church of Christ. It was standing room only at this sister church. There were speakers and many musicians. There was a time for singing and prayers. Students from Saugatuck Schools spoke as well. These student speakers offered some very moving testimonies about their concerns and a desire to make all people safe. They spoke of the need for legislation to put restrictions on gun ownership.

After the gathering at the church, we joined some 400 people who were marching. People came from Douglas, Saugatuck, Holland, South Haven and other communities to express concern about gun violence.

Both of these events spoke to me of what it means to be faithful in following Jesus. That both events took place so close to Holy Week, reminded me of the very difficult walk that Jesus took on our behalf. We are called to follow Jesus. Called to walk with him. To do so, often means making difficult decisions.

In addition to the two events listed above, I have been working with our high school youth as they look at issues of prejudice and bigotry. They will present a sermon on this in April. I attended a presentation by Matthew Desmond, author of the book, Evicted. Powerful stories of people living in poverty and housing issues.

Sanctuary, immigration, prejudice, bigotry, gun violence, housing and poverty - these are just some of the difficult issues facing us as a nation. How do we decide how to live out our faith in these days? Are we willing to have some discussions about the many issues being raised in our nation? What place does faith play in these discussions? I would welcome having these discussions; in small groups, one on one, after worship or mid-week. Let me know if you would like to be a part of these conversations.
