Giving Opportunities During Advent and Christmas

Christmas Fund - Veterans of the Cross - this special offering is collected by the Mission Board and is given to the United Church of Christ. One of the special aspects of the Christmas Fund is that the funds do not support programs, make grants to institutions, or fund advocacy programs, but rather, they provide direct financial assistance to individual retired UCC clergy and lay employees. This offering is collected through December 22nd.

Project Christmas Hope - There are tags on the small tree in the Narthex. These are gifts for children in the community. This is in cooperation with We Care, I.N.C. and our Mission Board. Presents are to be returned by December 9th.

"Christmas" offering - Our Christmas Offering will be received this year to benefit our mission and ministry with those experiencing need.

A quarter of the offering will go directly to our Food Pantry to help restock the shelves for the coming year. The pantry has served over 800 families this year. Another quarter will be given to the Diaconate Fund that helps with emergency needs.

The remainder will go into the general fund to support the pantry (utilities and building maintenance) as well as our ongoing ministries here at the church.

SUNDAYS OF ADVENT

Worship will be based on the theme of Heaven and Nature Sing. This is a celebration of the 300th anniversary of the Christmas Carol, "Joy to the World."

Composer Isaac Watt's interpretation of Psalm 98 invites us to sing a "new song"and it is a powerful cosmic performance of all creation being renewed and freed. Rather than "joy" being yet another word for "happiness," we will discover that the depths of joy can be found especially in the midst of suffering, the work of justice, and the presence of compassion-all part of the coming of Jesus to this world and a message the world still so desperately needs.

Advent is a time of celebration for people of all ages. Children and youth will provide leadership during worship. There will be a "living" Advent Wreath each Sunday to help us on our journey to Christmas.

Celebrate Advent this year with devotions at home and engaging worship here at church.

Here is a brief look at worship during Advent.

Advent 1: December 1st "Prepare Him Room: Hopeful Joy"

Communion will be celebrated. Scripture: Isaiah 2:1-5 and Romans 13:11-14 Mary Pietenpol will be our musician.

Advent 2: December 8th "Repeat the Sounding Joy: Loving Joy"

Scripture: Isaiah 11:1-10 and Matthew 3:1-15

Advent 3: December 15th "Make the Blessings Known: Unabashed Joy"

Scripture: Isaiah 35: 1-10 and Luke 1: 46b-55

Advent 4: December 22nd "Make the Nations Prove: Peaceful Joy"

Scripture: Isaiah 7: 13-15 Matthew 1: 18-25

December 24th: Christmas Eve "The Lord is Come: Incarnate Joy"

7 P.M.: A traditional Christmas Eve service that will include the singing of all four verses of Silent Night, Holy Night and the lighting of individual candles.

There will be a special time for children, the reading of the Christmas Story and the singing of many Christmas Carols.

Outside the church will be luminaries to light the night and guide us forward.

This service is designed for all people of all ages. Do know you are most welcomed here.

The Calvin Scholarship

What is it? In October it was presented as a scholarship facilitated by our congregation since 1979. It began with a bequest to First Congregational from the estate of the late Grace Calvin, who directed we set up a scholarship program to help graduates of South Haven High School planning to get post high school education.

Since that date 470 students have been helped, some for one year and some for four full years of study. Most have attended colleges, but some of the grants have been used for technical, medical, business, even culinary arts education.

The amount of the grants varied from \$250 in the early years to the current scholarships of \$3000. The terms of Miss Calvin's will specify a total of \$3000 per student, but with the help of the Kalamazoo Foundation, which has been handling the finances, the Advisory Committee hopes to increase that amount, due to the high cost of further education and the amount of money the fund has earned.

What is most interesting about the scholarship winners is the number who have returned to live and share their skills with the South Haven area. Seventeen returned to teach in our school system: thirteen returned to create, manage or work for local businesses. Three share their education as government, legal or community leaders. Two went into the local medical field and one serves as a pastor of a local church.

Miss Calvin's contribution has been long, far reaching, and much appreciated. If you would like to know more about her as a person, please ask her nephew Jerry Gruber.
