## WORSHIP

### February 3rd - The Power of God's Word and Communion

Luke 4:21-30 is the focus scripture and the theme is The Power of God's Word. Communion will be celebrated.

### February 10th: Scout Sunday and Being Surprised

Boy and Girl Scouts will help to lead our worship service this morning. It will begin with a flag procession, the Pledge of Allegiance and an opening song. Scouts will serve as ushers, greeters, Lay Assistant and readers. All Scouts in attendance will receive a special patch for the day.

Many special recognitions will be celebrated this Sunday. A new Scout troop for girls has begun here at the church. This will be their first official event. We will celebrate the God and Country achievements of a number of our scouts. We will recognize the most recent Eagle Scouts in our congregation, including Zachary Hanner, Yamil Garcia and Joe Nelson.

The scripture passage for this day is from Luke 5:1-11 and the theme is Being Surprised.

### February 17: Being Blessed

To be blessed is to be given a gift unexpectedly and without strings. The passages for this Sunday show us the unique status that being blessed is for human beings. A blessing can change the core of who we are. You are blessed.

### February 24th: Be Holy

What does it mean to be holy? Jesus gives some examples in our reading for today in Luke 6:27-38. It means to love your enemy, to show mercy, to turn the other cheek and to do to others as you would have them do to

you. We will explore this at the Adult Class and in worship.

### March 3rd: Transfiguration and Living in Glory

Jesus performs three actions in the account of his transfiguration in Luke 9:28-43. He reveals the glory of his true self, rebukes his closest students for their narrow-sightedness and half-heartedness, extends himself with compassion.

These three actions are the actions Christ offers as the path of faith: Accept the glory. Open up our minds and senses. Extend compassion. Glory. Openness. Compassion. "And all were astounded by the greatness of God"

### Looking Ahead to Lent

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, which this year is March 6<sup>th</sup>. Members of our confirmation Class will be leading the Ash Wednesday service to be held here at the church at 7 p.m.



### Ringling Chimes at Church School
