The Christmas Fund (formerly known as Veterans of the Cross) totaled \$ 500. These funds are used to support retired pastors, many who served small churches and have small pensions. Some funds are used in emergency situations for these former church workers.

The Christmas offering this year was designated to be split between our own Diaconate Fund (to help people in need) and the General Fund (which provides the building and utilities for the Food Pantry). This offering **totaled \$ 1463!**
