Grace and Peace to you in the name of Jesus our Christ,

Thank you for all of the liturgical exploration and labor we did together in the month of May. I'm grateful for those who acolyte, sing, play instruments, run tech, lay lead, turn the lights on and off, tend the children, send email announcements, care for the grounds, count the money, greet each other with warmth, feed the hungry, set up zoom meetings, pray for our members and extended families, update screens, tithe, study scripture on Wednesday nights, and on and on. Living the Gospel is a communal endeavor and no act of consecration is too small. It takes all of us. I see you doing it. Thank you.

We are entering the liturgical season of Pentecost together. Wear your red! Blaze those bonfires! Celebrate the birth of the church and the arrival of the Holy Spirit with boldness!

The worship theme of the month is Divine Diversity: The Many Images of God. We will look at diverse languages, foods, ecology and forms of love as expressions of the divine life. I welcome those who have the desire and capacity to deepen their study of scripture to attend Bible Study on Wednesday nights at 7pm. As I've witnessed bewildering and painful dynamics happen in our society and its major institutions around gun violence and the harm/death of children and people of color, foreign policy and war devastation, reproductive rights and the sanctity of life, and the place of vaccines and masks inside of this pandemic, I can't help but notice two themes. Some of us are struggling to hear (truly truly hear) each other across differences, and there seems to be an insistence on choosing between the mutually exclusive options of individual liberty and collective responsibility.

We are an inextricably bound species on (divine) purpose; the individual is made possible by the social and the social is composed of individuals. Further, I think what brilliant neo-orthodox Christian theological Paul Tillich once wrote is true: "The first duty of love is to listen." How can we live faithfully into the paradox of our social and individual existence and honor the first duty of love to listen, as Christians? What does this look like for you in practice/discipleship?

In times when culture wars get louder and louder I try to recenter in scripture because my first allegiance is always to Christ. Here are the two passages I read every single morning. I share them in hopes that some of you might also find them helpful and grounding.

Philippians 2:

"Do nothing out of selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility consider others as more important than yourselves. Everyone should look not to his own interests, but rather to the interests of others."

And this passage from 1 Cor 12:

"...the members of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, ²³ and those members of the body that we think less honorable we clothe with greater honor, and our less respectable members are treated with greater respect; ²⁴ whereas our more respectable members do not need this. But God has so arranged the body, giving the greater honor to the inferior member, ²⁵ that there may be no dissension within the body, but the members may have the same care for one another. ²⁶ If one members user suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it."
