## November Worship

We celebrate the month of November as The Season of Thanksgiving. Our colors are gold. Our Doxology is the song, Give Thanks.

Celebrate all you are thankful for during this month. Count your blessings.

### Sunday, November 4<sup>th</sup>

We will celebrate with our children and youth as they present the scripture reading for us this morning. During October they have been studying the story of Paul and Silas in Prison as found in Acts 16. They have made a video to help tell the story.

While Paul and Silas are in prison, they give thanks! An amazing story. This is also a Sunday closest to All Saints Day and we will remember those who have died in the past year.

Communion will be celebrated. Beginning with Sunday, November 4<sup>th</sup>, all bread served for communion will be gluten free. This is so that everyone will be able to take of the bread on the one plate that is passed. The Diaconate approved this at their September meeting. This is another way that we communicate that all are welcome here.

### Sunday, November 11<sup>th</sup> Music Sunday and Veterans Day

A special Sunday of music will help us celebrate this morning. The Blue Star Ramblers will be guest musicians. Ann Habicht will be ringing a special piece and the Chancel Choir will participate as well. In addition, we will sing a number of hymns and songs. Instead of a sermon, there will be more music.

Special Bell Ringing: On November 11, 2018, at 11:00 am, handbell musicians across America are invited to toll bells in their communities to commemorate the centennial of the armistice that brought an end to hostilities in what Americans fervently hoped had been "the war to end all wars." will have a special bell ringing at 11 a.m. during our worship. We will also ring our church bell as a part of the Bells of Peace this morning.

Following worship, the Annual Meeting of the church will take place in Fellowship Hall.

### Sunday, November 18<sup>th</sup>

The children and youth of our church will present their Giving Thanks video as part of the Time with Children.

Worship will be based on the following scripture readings:

Hebrews 10:11-25 and Mark 13:1-8 - both readings speak of hope in difficult times.

### Sunday, November 25<sup>th</sup>: Thanksgiving Sunday

This is the Sunday after Thanksgiving and we will celebrate it as Thanksgiving Sunday. Our hymns will be traditional Thanksgiving songs. We will dedicate memorial gifts this Sunday as one way of giving thanks.

Our scripture lessons speak about giving thanks. The story of the Ten Lepers in Luke 17:11-19 is powerful, and Paul's closing words in 1 Thessalonians 5:12-28 remind us to rejoice always and give thanks in all circumstances.

### **Calvin Adult Scholarship**

Many years ago, two scholarship funds were established here at the church in memory of the Calvin Family. One of those continues to offer scholarships to graduates

of South Haven High School. That fund has a small committee that reviews applications. Elaine Fluck is the current chairperson. This year they awarded 18 scholarships totaling \$ 26,000.

The other fund began as a college loan fund. This was changed 25 years ago to be a scholarship for adults going back to college or trade school and was renamed, The Calvin Adult Scholarship Fund. A committee oversaw the fund and would grant individual requests. It also worked with an Adult Education Program here in South Haven. When that program closed, the fund connected with Lake Michigan College. It awarded scholarships to adults over the age of 25 returning to college. This past year, 3 scholarships of \$1,000 each were awarded. We have received thank you notes from each of those students. You can see more about this in the letter with this newsletter.

The committee that has overseen this fund agree 2 years ago that when the fund balance dropped below \$10,000, that we would donate all the money to Lake Michigan College Scholarship Fund. The fund has not had any additions for many years. The fund balance has now dropped and so the Board of Trustees have voted to send the remaining balance to the college for them to award to students until the money runs out.

We are proud of the many students we have been able to assist. These funds have been a significant blessing to many.

## History of Veterans Day



World War I - known at the time as "The Great War" - officially ended when the Treaty of Versailles was signed on June 28, 1919, in the Palace of Versailles outside the town of Versailles, France. However, fighting ceased seven months earlier when an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities, between the Allied nations and Germany went into effect on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. For that reason, November 11, 1918, is generally regarded as the end of "the war to end all wars."

An Act (52 Stat. 351; 5 U. S. Code, Sec. 87a) approved May 13, 1938, made the 11th of November in each year a legal holiday—a day to be dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be thereafter celebrated and known as "Armistice Day." Armistice Day was primarily a day set aside to honor veterans of World War I.

In 1954, after World War II had required the greatest mobilization of soldiers, sailors, Marines and airmen in the Nation's history; after American forces had fought aggression in Korea, the 83rd Congress, at the urging of the veterans service organizations, amended the Act of 1938 by striking out the word "Armistice" and inserting in its place the word "Veterans." With the approval of this legislation (Public Law 380) on June 1, 1954, November 11th became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.
