The Grotto of the Nativity in Bethlehem where Jesus was born holds oil lamps with a flame that is said to have been burning for over 1,500 years. This flame stands as a symbol of the hope that the world will embrace Peace for all.

A solemn ceremony will take place at JFK International Airport on December 11th. Austrian Airlines has provided a plane to bring the light to North America. The Catholic Committee on Scouting, Diocese of Brooklyn and Queens is working on plans for the distribution ceremony;

That light is now coming to South Haven, MI to be distributed to any who would like to have it in their home. It will also be used to light the many candles at our Christmas Eve Service.
